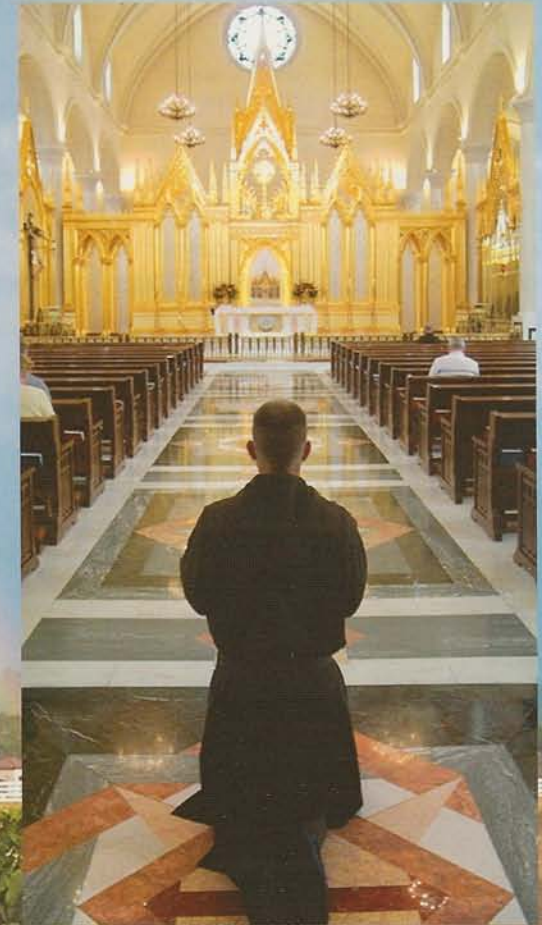




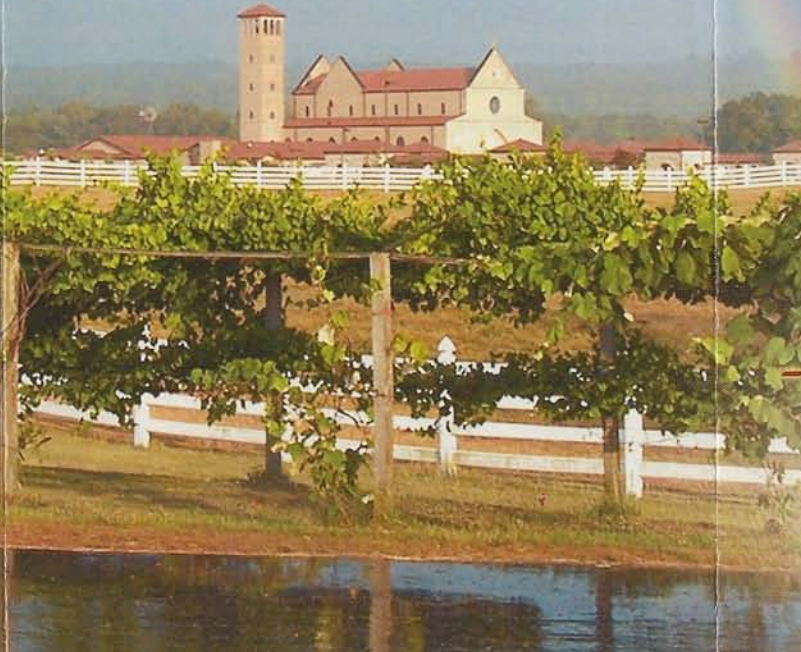

On July 25, 1998, during construction of Our Lady of the Angels Monastery and the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Mother Angelica, foundress of the *Eternal Word Television Network*, founded the **Knights of the Holy Eucharist.**

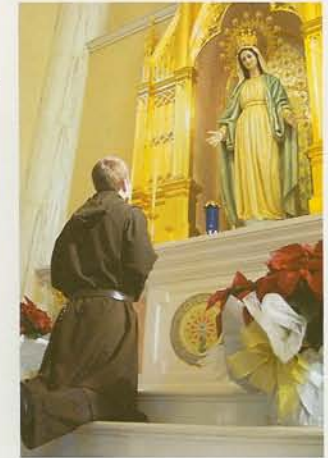
The Knights prostrate during the consecration at daily Mass.
